GRAND KNIGHTS REPORT

Brother Knights and Families,

I write to you this month having just returned from the Grand Knight's Workshop in Columbia where new Grand Knights, Deputy Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries spent a day being trained by our State Officers on how to complete required State and Supreme reports, fill out forms, and a myriad of "behind the scenes" activities and responsibilities that are required to be a successful Council. We were also given our new member, insurance and ceremonials goals for the upcoming year. For this fraternal year, we are challenged to produce 13 new Brother Knights, 7 new Insurance Members and hold six 1st Degree ceremonies.

These are the minimum goals for obtaining Star Council, the highest honor that can be bestowed on a Council. I had the privilege of presenting PGK Neil Whitman with his long overdue Star Council Award at our last business meeting and was recently informed by our District Deputy that we fulfilled all of the requirements to once again be honored as a Star Council for the amazing work our Council did last year under PGK Rick Karkowski. Congratulations once again to Neil and Rick for leading our Council to this prestigious honor.

Driving home from Columbia I started asking myself how we were going to continue the momentum started by Neil and Rick and once again obtain Star Council for a third consecutive year. The answer while simple finally came to me about 15 miles out of Charleston; recruit new members and retain existing members. DGK Brenden Lo is the chairman of our membership committee and is charged with developing our Council's plan for both the Fall and Spring Blitz at all of our Churches. Brenden will have my full support as well as the support from the entire slate of officers to make our membership blitz successful; however the best way to identify a prospective new member lies within each of us. Simply ask a Catholic gentleman if he would like to join the Knights of Columbus. Thirteen is not an extremely large number and if each of us asks just one person we see at Church, and even if half of them decline, given the size of our membership we should easily meet and exceed that number.



COUNCIL OFFICERS

A few thoughts on member recruitment....

Every year and almost every meeting we hear the mantra.

Recruit...Blitz...Recruit. It seems like the Knights of Columbus is hanging by a thread and if we don't bring in 5, 10, 15, etc. new members the whole organization will crumble. State Deputies know that making their quotas will put them in the "circle of honor". Not making it will give them a chair near the men's

room. Why all the fuss?

Since I attend meeting for many councils, I get a unique perspective and a chance to see what effect strong recruiting or weak recruiting has on the performance of the councils I serve. The difference is striking. Councils that make their recruiting numbers with regularity have an energy that is definitely lacking in councils that don't. Everything works. Leaders lead and the workers work. The steady flow of new members ensures there will be a steady flow of members achieving their 2nd and 3rd degrees and the leadership development for the council is a river, not a trickle. Most of all, councils with strong recruitment have the manpower to take ideas and make them reality.

Weak recruitment has the opposite effect. Without a steady flow of new members, the energy of the council is drained. The same members seem to do all the work and they burn out. Leadership becomes stagnant and it becomes difficult to fill officer and director positions. There are few members taking 2nd and 3rd degrees so the problem gets worse every year. As the council weakens internally, its ability to serve the parish and community declines and recruitment becomes even more difficult and the downward spiral continues.

The scary thing is that no successful council is more than a few bad recruiting years from becoming dysfunctional. The good news is most struggling councils are only a few solid recruiting years away from being successful again. Recruitment is not major surgery. We know how to do it and we do it better than any other organization. When we get in trouble is when we fail to give recruitment the proper priority in our councils. Successful councils have strong membership chairmen and solid membership and retention committees. Successful councils schedule degrees in advance and make sure there are new members available for these degrees. And most of all, successful councils make sure that every member knows that it is his responsibility to help with this vital function.

As we begin a new fraternal year, we need to look at our own council and ask "which direction are we going." "Do we have the right people in place to have a successful recruiting year?" Don't wait until our State Deputy is assigned a seat next to the men's room to make the changes you need to make. It really is that important.
