
CHRISTMAS SOCIAL





KNIGHT OF THE MONTH November, 2006 Greg Gormley

GARDENING COLUMN

By mulching leaves with the lawn mower, you will get a fine-textured mulch that can be placed around flowers, shrubs and trees. Use about 2-3 inches. Keep about 4 inches from trunks of trees and shrubs. This is a good time for a general yard cleanup. Cut back annuals and perennials that have died and dried up. This discourages disease and insects for next year. Dig up tender summer bulbs, i.e., caladiums, dahlias, gladiolas and store for the winter. Remove diseased and damaged free limbs. Any major

Remove diseased and damaged tree limbs. Any major pruning should be done in February.

Cold and wind can kill dry plants. Continue to water plants and shrubs as needed.

Do not prune spring-flowering shrubs and trees until after they bloom. Crape myrtles should be pruned by 1 January. If you have scale or aphids on trees and shrubs, use Volck oil. It does a better job of suffocating insects and eggs. Be cautious of nighttime lows. Freezing temperatures shortly after an application of Volck can burn plants.

Take cuttings now of favorite plants.

Poinsettias are grown at a temperature of 70-72 degrees during the day and 60 degrees at night in greenhouses. To water, check soil daily. If surface is dry to the touch, water until water runs freely from bottom. Be sure to remove any decorative wrap from bottom and place pot in a saucer so it can drain.

If using a live Christmas tree, water it as soon as you bring it home. It may absorb as much as a gallon of water. Check the water level once or twice a day after that. Even if the tree doesn't use it, a pet may be drinking the water. There is a new type of Pansy out. It is Matrix. Supposedly it is larger and more durable.
