



GARDENING COLUMN


Poinsettias should be in bright light but away from drafts. Water twice a week. To allow proper drainage, remove decorative wrapping. After the holidays, they can be put outside, even planted. DID YOU KNOW? Poinsettias originally came from Mexico. They

were sent here by Dr. Joel Poinsett, who was the first US Ambassador to Mexico in 1828, from the Taxco area of Mexico. The bright-colored bracts reminded the Mexicans of the Star of Bethlehem and associated the poinsettias with Christmas.

Be sure to water plants that are green above ground. Dry plants will be killed faster by hard freezes and cold winds than plants plump with moisture. Potted plants dry out faster, too.

New shrubs and trees should be planted during their dormant season (now through January). Keep them watered to be sure they are well-established before hot weather and protect from freezing temperatures. Major pruning for many trees and shrubs should be done during the dormant period. Do NOT prune spring-flowering shrubs, such as azaleas and forsythia until AFTER they bloom. Transplant roses now. Wait until January to prune roses.

Prune sasanquas and camellias after they finish blooming. Clean up dropped blooms to prevent scale.
