
May God continue to bless our council and our country.

KNIGHT OF THE MONTH Brenden Lo May, 2006

Brenden was born in Singapore and spent his early years following his father, a State Department employee, around the world until 1975 when the family settled in Dallas, TX. After a short stint is St. Louis, the family settled down long enough for Brenden to attend Winston Churchill H.S. and the University of Maryland, College Park. He graduated in 1990 with a degree in Management Studies.

He went to work for Sovran Bank and after a six-year career in finance; he decided to become an airline pilot and moved to Farmington, NM to work for Mesa Airlines. After Mesa, it was a move back to Dallas to work for American Airlines. After American, he moved to Hilton Head in 1995 to work for a fraternity brother's father at Hilton Head Labs. A few months later, it was back to the airlines, this time Midway Airlines in Hilton Head. In 1998, Brenden finally got into the Continental Airlines system with Colgan Air/Continental Connection. In 1999, he took over as General Manager of Myrtle Beach with Continental Express. Shortly after 9/11, he was asked to come to Charleston and officially took over as General Manager in Nov 2001, this time with Continental Airlines.

GARDENING COLUMN

Water grass deeply, at least 1" to 1 1/1" per week to promote a deeper root system. It is better to water in the morning. It gives the grass time to dry before nightfall and reduces the risk of fungus disease.

Hydrangeas, gardenias, crape myrtle, forsythia, camellias, azaleas, mock orange should be pruned as soon as they finish blooming.

Check azaleas and camellias for leaf galls, which are often caused by gall flies and wasps. They are primarily a cosmetic problem and should be removed by

hand. Destroy galls as soon as they appear. Sasanquas are more of a problem than japonicas (both in the camellia family.)

Hydrangeas bloom on second-year wood. When pruning, cut 1/3 of the limbs all the way to the ground each year. For blue flowers use aluminum sulfate; for pink flowers use lime.

For more blooms and bushier plants, cut geraniums back 1/2 to 3/4 per stem just above a node. You can plant geranium and impatien cuttings in sand or use rootone and plant in soil.

Leggy impatiens and coleus can be pinched back. A hard pruning will give them new life through late summer into fall. Mums should be pinched back until mid-July. Feed roses every two weeks for more blooms. Roots should be watered every 4-5 days. In extremely hot weather, water foliage early in the day. To prevent black spot, use a fungicide. Spray both sides of the leaves. When using systemic food and pesticides, be sure to wear long sleeves and gloves. It can be absorbed through the skin.


Plant gladiolas, caladiums, cannas and dahlias for fall color. Divide irises and Easter lilies after they bloom. When the leaves of spring-flowering bulbs turn brown, cut back foliage and fertilize.

Plant trees and shrubs in the winter when they are dormant unless you are willing to water deeply and frequently until they are well established.

Inspect plants for scale, aphids and spider mites. Replace the mulch on ornamental and landscape plants to prevent disease.

Raise the level of the lawn mower blade. Longer grass blades help shade soil and keep it cooler and moist. Never cut more than 1/3 of growth. Don't bag.

Ask your vet and garden center about biological flea controls for your lawn and pets.
