

GARDENING COLUMN

The optimum time for pruning most summer-flowering trees and shrubs, including crape myrtle and oleander, is between February 17 and March 17.

Crape myrtles bloom on new wood. When pruning, you should have 3-5 trunks. Prune any crossing limbs or, where there are three limbs, remove the middle limb. Bird feeders and bird houses should be cleaned. Put food for the hummingbirds out towards the end of March. Now is the time to plant roses. Keep well-watered. Prune roses and start routine spraying. Because roses are susceptible to diseases and insects, they require preventive applications of fungicides and insecticides. If honeybees are present, spray around dusk to avoid killing these essential pollinators. Other susceptible plants include azaleas, camellias (spray when not in bloom) and dogwood trees. Use cygon to prevent scale on camellias.

Prune and feed azaleas and camellias after they finish blooming. To prevent petal blight, rake up any fallen blooms. Put down fresh mulch.

Start flats of summer annual flowers for planting at the end of the month or in April.

If houseplants are to spend the summer outdoors, repot now. This gives them time to adjust before setting outside next month.

Spring-flowering bulbs should be fertilized after they bloom. Cut the leaves of early-flowering bulbs after they have turned brown. They need to build energy through the leaves for next year.

Shrubs should be fertilized as soon as they begin to show new growth.

If summer and fall-blooming perennial clumps need it, divide and transplant now. Keep new divisions watered. Bedding plants should be "hardened of" before planting. Bring them indoors for about 4 nights and take them out during the day. This will acclimate them to withstand cool temperatures. Usually St. Patrick's Day is a good day for planting.

Do not fertilize grass until two weeks after it has become fully green. Weed & Feed is for cool-weather lawns and not suitable for our area. Do not thatch centipede or St. Augustine grass until April or May.

It is too early to use pesticides on the lawn. Mole crickets are very sensitive to the cold and are deep in the soil right now.
