

GARDENING COLUMN

Watering grass deeply, at least 1" to 1 ½" per week, it promotes a deeper root system. By watering in the morning it gives the grass time to dry before nightfall and reduces the risk of fungus disease.

Hydrangeas, gardenias, crape myrtles, forsythia, camellias, azaleas, mock orange should be pruned as soon as they finish blooming

Hydrangeas bloom on second-year wood. When pruning, cut 1/3 of the limbs all the way to the ground each year. For blue flowers, use aluminum sulfate, for pink flowers use lime.

Cut geraniums back to ½ to ¾ per stem just above a node for more blooms and bushier plants. Plant geranium and impatiens cuttings in sand or use rootone and plant in soil

A hard pruning will give leggy impatiens will give them a new life through late summer into fall Mums should be pinched back until mid-July.

Feed roses every two weeks for more blooms. Roots should be watered every 4-5 days. In extremely hot weather, water foliage early in the day. To prevent black spot, use a fungicide. Spray both sides of the leaves. When using system food and pesticides, be sure to wear long sleeves and gloves. It can be absorbed through the skin.

For fall bloom, plant gladiolas, caladiums, cannas and dahlias Divide Day lilies and Easter lilies after they bloom.

Bulbs can be dug up and replanted any time after the leaves turn brown. This is the best time to divide and replant because you can see the dead leaves. By waiting until fall, you may dig up newly-planted bulbs.

Replace the mulch on ornamental and landscape plants to prevent disease.

Raise the level of the lawn mower blade. Longer grass blades help shade soil and keep it cooler and moist. Never cut more than 1/3 of growth. Don't bag

Ask your vet and garden center about biological flea controls for your lawn and pets

Estate planning is a particularly important part of what anyone approaching those "golden years" does. Accomplishing it well is sometimes very difficult. Insurance plays an important roll in most estates and the Knights of Columbus offer some of the best. I see people all the time who have done a marvelous job of providing for their retirement years but who fall short when planning for their own death or that of a spouse. The key is LIQUIDITY.

Liquidity is a source of liquid funds, cash or other assets that can be transformed quickly into cash to settle the estate. If adequate liquidity is provided, probate is short and assets are transferred at close to full value. If not, the nightmare begins.

Costs that must be provided for are Funeral Costs, Administration Costs, Debts, Federal Estate Taxes, State Death Taxes and Liquidation Losses. At a benefits night a couple of weeks ago a second speaker for the evening was the local funeral home director. When asked what the AVERAGE cost of a funeral was, his reply was "about \$10,000. Additional expenses can include Probating the Will, Advertising for Creditors, Providing and Paying for Bond, meeting expenses for Claims against the Estate, Estate Upkeep and Preparing and Filing a Final Tax Return.

You only get one shot at doing it right so make sure you know what's waiting for you behind door number three. If you have questions, call me at 843-379-9319.
